# Why Outsource to Jamaica

- Strategic location and accessibility. A major driver for Jamaican outsourcing is its advantageous location relative to the USA and Canada
- Only 90 minutes away from Miami via air and over 400 international flights weekly. This facilitates flexibility in travel, shorter travel times and convenience in ad hoc travel situations
- Being located within the Eastern time zone (UTC -5), interaction with North American offices and Jamaican operations can easily be facilitated during normal business hours



# Why Outsource to Jamaica continued

- An educated, diverse, and loyal English-speaking talent pool with a population of approximately 2.8 million with a labor force of 1.3 million
- Jamaica has the 3rd largest English-speaking population in the Americas, behind the USA and Canada
- As heavy consumers of American media, there is strong cultural affinity between Jamaica and North America
   a significant advantage for customer-facing outsourcing activities involving North American customers


# **Jamaica Business Processes Outsourcing**

- Over 40 companies offer contact center and Business Processes Outsourcing (BPO) services in Jamaica
- Companies are a combination of captives and outsourcing providers, as well as local and foreign-owned companies
- Majority of operations are located in Montego Bay, Kingston and Portmore
- 23 companies operating over 5 years; 11 companies over 10 years
- Jamaica's outsourcing sector is estimated at 17,000 agents, and generates revenues in excess of USD 500 million annually




## **BPO Sector**


### **Industries Served**

## **Jamaica Talent**


- Education in Jamaica is based on the British system
- Primary school curriculum (Grades 1 − 6) has been developed by the Ministry of Education
- Secondary School curriculum (Grades 7—13) is regionally developed by the Caribbean Examination Council (CXC)
- CXC administers two examinations:
  - Caribbean Secondary Examination Certificate (CSEC) formerly O-Levels at Grade 11
  - Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Certificate (CAPE) formerly A-Levels at Grade 13
- Based on their results at either the CSEC or the CAPE examinations, students can matriculate successfully into a
   3-year or 4-year university degree program

# **English Language Capability**

- Solution Jamaica has the 3rd largest native English-speaking population in the Americas, behind the USA and Canada
- All tuition across the entire education system (kindergarten to university) is conducted in English
- As major tourist destination for North American visitors and as a native English-speaking country, Jamaica is well-positioned to excel at voice and customer-facing services
- Although Jamaicans tend to speak with an accent, it can be easily neutralized
  - However, some firms have opted to maintain the Jamaican accent as customers make favorable/pleasant associations with Jamaica and the agents because of it

- In 2014, approx. 15,760 students graduated from the main tertiary
- With enrolment increasing year on year, graduate numbers are also expected to increase
- The table (left) show graduate numbers for popular disciplines
- The table does not include outputs from short courses or professional development initiatives for which students do not officially graduate

# **Tertiary Education**

- Over 74,000 people enrolled in tertiary-level institutions in Jamaica
- There are 4 main universities, and over 120 colleges and other tertiary institutions in Jamaica, some of which offer specialty disciplines, e.g. teaching, business, accounting, etc.
- The four main universities account for 50% of the tertiary enrolment (2013/2014):
  - Northern Caribbean University: 6,165
  - University College of the Caribbean: 3,493
  - University of Technology: 13,150
  - University of the West Indies: 15,515
